The games also encourage pupils to share and cooperate with each other.</p> <p>Through our role play activities pupils learn to prioritise tasks, discuss and make decisions as a team.</p>

SCN 1-13a.</p>	<p>Scottish SPCA workshop Wild about animals workshop Our wildlife welfare workshop focuses on the diversity of Scottish wildlife that we help and introduces ideas of how children can help protect these animals.</p> <p>This workshop raises issues such as what animals depend on to survive thus giving examples of food chains. It also looks at the adaptations that some animals have had to take, in order to survive in their present environment.</p> <p>The risks involved with coming into contact with wild animals are highlighted, and emphasis is placed on pupils not touching any animal they come across. In particular if it is a wild animal awareness is raised that this animal could inflict an injury or they could pass on a disease.</p>

Pupils learn quickly that they need to give other pupils the opportunity to ask questions and they need to listen to the Scottish SPCA staff member in order to gain the most out of their experience.</p> <p>A lot of information is conveyed during our workshops and at the end of each workshop pupils are quizzed to see how much they have learnt and the choices they would make in certain situations (for example if they saw someone being cruel to an animal or if they found a baby bird).</p>

Creating texts

All workshops

Any words that have been used during the workshop which pupils have been unfamiliar with (for example the words 'welfare', 'nocturnal' or 'habitat') will be reiterated at the end of the workshop to ensure pupils have learnt their meaning.

Part of the workshop involves group work and through this pupils can listen and talk within their groups and share experiences they have had with animals.

Scottish SPCA workshop

All workshops

Throughout our workshops we highlight the varying environments that animals live in such as what pets need to keep them healthy and happy or where animals live in their communities.

Emphasis is placed on how the pupils themselves can become responsible animal friendly citizens around their school and in their communities and help us help look after all of the animals in Scotland.

Food and farming workshop

Pupils learn about the work of the Scottish SPCA with Scotland's farming and food industries, highlighting where our food comes from and choices children can make regarding farm animal welfare. It also highlights where animals are kept and how much of the land in Scotland has been turned towards agriculture.

Wild about animals workshop

It is highlighted in our wildlife workshop that many of the wild animals discussed have changed their habitats and food sources due to the changes in Scotland's landscape. Pupils are asked to identify how the environment has influenced our animals that live in Scotland.

All workshops

One of the aims of all of our workshops is to get pupils to identify who the Scottish SPCA are and how we can help their communities.

All workshops promote kindness and respect towards the treatment of all animals that pupils may come across. We ensure that pupils know what to do if they do find an animal that needs help or if they see someone being cruel towards an animal enabling them to make the right decision.

Pupils are made aware of the laws surrounding animal welfare in Scotland and thus the consequences of the various stories they see, hear or read regarding cruelty towards animals.

The information that pupils learn in our workshops will hopefully influence their choices and decisions towards the treatment of animals.

Numeracy and mathematics

Number, money and measure

Estimation and rounding

Scottish SPCA workshop

All workshops

Uniquely created for the Scottish SPCA our card games are a great way for pupils to learn about the many domestic, farm and wild animals that the Scottish SPCA saves from harm and danger every year. Numeracy is used to help pupils learn life histories of various animals.

Pet Patrol workshop

In our pet patrol workshop pupils are asked to discuss the costs involved when owning a pet animal. This includes selecting a potential shopping list and adding up the total cost for that animal. This activity is great for discussion and debate but also makes use of pupils applying their mathematical skills to real life costs.

At the end of our workshops pupils are asked what facts they have learned from playing the card games thus helping to assess how pupils have interpreted the numerical information provided.
